The Uniqueness of the Christian Vision of Life

- 5. Topics such as environmentalism, social equality, universal brotherhood, women's equality are all embedded in the teachings of Jesus
- 6. Transforms lives

Attain self-realisation through truth and non-violence


Marxism:

What is Christian Life?

It is a lifestyle guided by the Holy Spirit according to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Church.

1. Accept and Proclaim Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord, Firmly Believing in the Holy Trinity

The foundation of Christian life is the faith in the Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is revealed to us by Jesus Christ, the second person of the Trinity and God's in carnation as man. No one can live as a Christian without accepting Jesus of Nazareth as the Messiah, the Son of God, (Jn 1:12) and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

"Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned" (Mk 16:15-16).

Peter to the People

Christian Life Guided by the Gospel

To lead a life according to the Gospel, guidance of Holy Spirit is necessary. Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21). "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock" (Mt 7:24).


Then someone came to him and said, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?" And Jesus said to him,..."If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments" (Mt19:16-17). Our life will be blessed when we start living according to the words of Jesus.

Christian Life Guided by the Teachings of the Church

Jesus gave the responsibility of his Church to St. Peter and said, "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven" (Mt 16:18-19). This verse implies that it is appropriate and natural for us to obey the governing authorities of the Church (Rom 13:1-2).

4. Mission Oriented Life

Evangelization is a mission entrusted by Jesus and accepted by the Church (Mk 16:15). For the same reason every member of the church is a missionary.

Mission Work in Different Forms

We can participate in the missionary work of the Church in different ways.

1. Proclamation of the Gospel

To proclaim the Gospel to all those who have never known about Jesus Christ.

2. Life Witness and Conversation

Through life witness and conversation, interact lovingly and respectfully with everyone.

3. Through Charity

Through charity, we should strive to propagate spirit of Christian love without discrimination of caste, creed and religion (To the Nation, No 10, 11,12).

In brief, in all situations of life, it is our responsibility to witness Jesus and spread his Gospel.

Throughout the world, large number of priests, religious and lay persons of our Church are serving as missionaries. They contribute to the growth of the Christian community and society around them. Our missionaries work tirelessly in the fields of education, health care and poverty alleviation.

The sole objective of missionary activities is not just preaching the Gospel alone, it is also a life of prayer, sacrifice, charity and being a role model. St. Thérèse of Lisieux and St. Alphonsa are best examples of missionaries who lead a life of prayer and sacrifice. It is our duty to pray for the missionaries and support their mission activities to the best of our abilities as missionaries of Jesus.

5. Live With Heavenas Your Destination

Heaven is the ultimate goal of Christian life. "Heaven is God's milieu, the dwelling place of the angels and saints, and the goal of creation" (YOUCAT 52). The Lord's prayer taught by Jesus begins with the salutation, "Our Father in Heaven"



Mission is an effort to sow and nurture the Church by proclaiming the Gospel to people or community who have not yet known or have faith in Jesus.

Death is Not the End, Rather a Journey to Heaven

"He makes partners in his heavenly glorification those who have believed in Him and remained faithful to his will. Heaven is the blessed community of all who are perfectly incorporated into Christ" (CCC 1026).

Heaven

"This perfect life with the Most Holy Trinity - this communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed is called "heaven." Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness" (CCC1024).

Symbols of Heaven in the Holy Bible: Life, Light, Peace, Wedding Celebrations, Father's Home, Heavenly Jerusalem, Paradise.

"But, as it is written, 'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him'" (1 Cor 2:9).

Christian life is not just a personal relationship between an individual and Jesus. It is also a life in communion with the entire worshipping community and Jesus.

6. Become Holy

All are called to holiness: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48) (CCC 2013). God invites all of us to this perfection. When we unite with him, we also participate in his holiness. Pope Francis in his apostolic exhortation "Rejoice and Be Glad", describes how to lead a holy life in today's world.

- 1. We are all called to be holy in our own way. Irrespective of who we are and where we are, our primary focus should be to lead a life filled with love.
- 2. Holiness is the fruit of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22-23).
- 3. Everyone can attain holiness. It doesn't deplete our energy, vitality or joy; instead, it nurtures them.
- 4. Through the beatitudes, Jesus presented a way of life that leads to holiness.
- 5. Perseverance, forgiveness and meekness are the signs of holiness.
- 6. The life of holiness is a constant battle against sin. This battle is beautiful because we consistently win with God's help.

Christian Life: A Way of Life

Christian life is a way of life. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the faithful embrace Jesus as their Savior and Lord. They publicly affirm their faith, receive Baptism, and join the Church community. They commit to follow the teachings of Jesus and the Church, aiming to achieve salvation. They
